We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (**AER**), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Brick Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 50/o of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 50/o of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 670/o, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Brick Elementary School did not receive a label.

At Brick Elementary School, we are dedicated to helping students do their best in English Language Arts (**ELA**) and math. We use a special curriculum that is based on research to make sure all students have the skills they need to succeed in school. Our teachers are always learning new ways to help students who learn in different ways. We want every student to feel challenged, supported, and ready to succeed. Our goal is to make sure every student has the chance to get a great education.

The school is always working on ways to improve, like setting goals for ELA, Math, Equity, and Social-Emotional Learning. In the past year, Brick Elementary's Parent Teacher Conferences showed that we held 890/o of possible conferences. What a great testament to teamwork and home to school partnership! If parents want to see the curriculum we use, they can find it on the district website or ask for a copy from the school.

Students are placed into elementary buildings based on several factors which include space, demographics and the best fit for the student.

As the Principal of Brick Elementary, it is both my duty and privilege to provide support to all of our students and staff in achieving our district goals. Our collaboration with community members and families is continuously expanding, and it is a highlight of the Lincoln Consolidated Schools experience.
